L-1 Virtual Meeting with Hamilton's Miguel Cervantes and Jin Ha, with VIP Tickets to Show

Alan Menken has been writing award-winning songs since the age of nine, when he entered a junior composer competition and scored "superior" ratings from the judges. His earliest stage successes came alongside his late writing partner, Howard Ashman. They scored first with *Little Shop of Horrors* Off-Broadway, soon followed by big-screen, box o ce hits.

The world took notice when Walt Disney Studios hired the duo in 1988 to score its animated film *The Little Mermaid*, which kicked off the Disney Renaissance. *The Little Mermaid* won the Academy Award for Best Original Score in 1989. Menken won three scoring Oscars in four years – for *The Little Mermaid*, *Beauty and the Beast* in 1991 and *Aladdin* in 1992.

You will have the chance to meet the Emmy, Grammy, Oscar and Tony Award-winning composer of nine Broadway musicals and scores of films. In addition, you will receive VIP tickets for you and a guest to see *Aladdin* on Broadway at the stunningly restored New Amsterdam Theatre.

After 18 months of the COVID pandemic, the musical phrase "Human Again" from *Beauty and the Beast* carries a whole new meaning. The song was originally written to express the joy and excitement the characters feel about being released from the curse set upon them by an evil enchantress. It was written for the film but ultimately cut, later to be added to the stage production when it opened on Broadway at the Palace Theatre in 1994. It is now included in all new releases of the film and in productions seen around the world.

This musical phrase was handwritten and signed by composer Alan Menken specifically for this year's auction. Isn't it great to begin to feel "Human Again?"

L-5 Chita Rivera print by Al Hirschfeld, signed by Chita Rivera

There is nobody like Chita! Chita Rivera made her Broadway debut as a replacement dancer in the original production of *Guys and Dolls*. She continued to dance in the ensemble and in small roles until she was cast as the fiery and fierce Anita in the original 1957 production of *West Side Story*. Never to be an ensemble dancer again, Rivera began a long and illustrious career as a leading lady in such shows as *Bye Bye Birdie*, *Kiss of the Spider Woman*, *Nine* and, most recently, *The Visit*, as well as an unforgettable performance as Nickie in the film *Sweet Charity*.

This sketch by legendary artist Al Hirschfeld features Rivera as Anna, the owner of a dilapidated roller rink in *The Rink*, the 1984 Kander and Ebb musical that earned Rivera her first Tony Award. *The Rink* also starred Liza Minnelli as her daughter and opened at the Martin Beck Theatre (now the Al Hirschfeld Theatre) on February 9, 1984. The musical received five Tony nominations and ran for 204 performances. The sketch of Rivera first appeared in *The New York Times'* Friday theater column on March 2, 1984.

Two-time Tony Award winner Bebe Neuwirth made her Broadway debut as Sheila in *A Chorus Line* before taking home Broadway's top award in 1986 for the revival of *Sweet Charity*. She went on to appear on television as Dr. Lilith Sternin-Crane on NBC's hit series *Cheers*, a role that would earn her two Emmy Awards as well. But it's the Broadway stage where she really thrives, as proved by her triumphant performance as Velma Kelly in the 1997 revival of *Chicago*.

You have the chance to meet this triple-threat in a one-on-one meeting on Zoom. Get to know the star of stage and screen and learn about her time dancing for the legendary Bob Fosse and her

Donna McKechnie and Lee Roy Reams have been dancing up a storm on the Broadway stage since the 1960s. McKechnie had danced and sang in five Broadway shows before she created the iconic role of Cassie in A Chorus Line, a performance that earned her the 1976 Tony Award for Best Performance by a Leading Actress in a Musical. Reams first appeared in the ensemble of Sweet Charity before earning leading man status as friendly cowpoke Will Parker in Oklahoma! in 1969. He was nominated for a Tony Award in 1980 for his stellar performance as Billy Lawlor in 42nd Street and last appeared on Broadway as Roger DeBris in The Producers.

Come Back to the Five & Dime Jimmy Dean, Jimmy Dean marked the Broadway debut of music icon Cher. The 1982 play revolves around a James Dean fan club, the Disciples of James Dean, who meet at a Woolworth's five-and-dime store in Texas. Cher's role of the waitress Sissy had originally been considered for Shelley Duvall, but after finding out Cher was in New York at the time, director Robert Altman (who also directed the film version later that year) encouraged her to read for the part. The first preview of the play took place on February 8, 1982, which would have been James Dean's 51st birthday. Come Back to the Five & Dime Jimmy Dean, Jimmy Dean ran at the Martin Beck Theatre (now the Al Hirschfeld Theatre) for 52 performances.

Three-time Tony Award recipient Bernadette Peters, a longtime friend of Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS, has a distinctly unique voice as both an artist and an advocate. She made her Broadway debut in *The Most Happy Fella*, but it was her starring role as Ruby in the 1966 original Off-Off-Broadway production of *Dames at Sea* that first pinned her as a performer audiences couldn't take their eyes off of.

L-16 Silver Sweeney Todd Meat Pie Gift from Angela Lansbury to Victor Garber

As a general rule, we wouldn't recommend biting into one of Mrs. Lovett's meat pies, but that holds especially true for this one. Sweeney Todd opened at the Uris Theatre (now known as the Gershwin Theatre) on March 1, 1979, with Len Cariou in the title role and Angela Lansbury as the conniving Mrs. Lovett. This solid silver meat pie was created by Lansbury in clay, then cast in silver as an opening night gift for Victor Garber, who originated the role of the lovestruck Anthony Hope. Weighing in at about just under five pounds, this extremely rare pie and one-of-a-kind Broadway collector's item may not be one of "The Worst Pies in London" after all.

L-17 Virtual Meeting with Disney Theatrical Productions President Thomas Schumacher

"How Does the Show Go On?" A mystery to many theater fans, but not to legendary producer Thomas Schumacher; he literally wrote the book on it. You'll be in for an amazing look into what it takes to bring an epic tale to life onstage or on screen when you virtually meet with Schumacher, president of Disney Theatrical Productions and a three-time Tony nominee.

Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS' dear friends Julie Halston and Charles Busch have been a powerhouse duo since they were founding members of Busch's theater company, Theatre-in-Limbo, in the 1980s. With Halston as his muse, Busch wrote several roles for her in his plays, creating a pair of undead divas for them to play in Vampire Lesbians of Sodom, as well as roles in The Lady in Question, Red Scare on Sunset, You Should Be So Lucky, The Divine Sister and The Tribute Artist. Busch was nominated for a Tony Award in 2001 for his play The Tale of the Allergist's Wife and Halston just took home the Isabelle Stevenson Tony Award for her humanitarian work with Pulmonary Fibrosis Foundation.

When A Chorus Line opened at the Shubert Theatre on June 25, 1975, Donna McKechnie was already an established Broadway performer, having appeared in the original companies of *Promises*, *Promises* and Stephen Sondheim's *Company*, among others. A Chorus Line made her a star. Much of her story in the role of Cassie was born from her own experiences throughout her dance career. Her stunning performance of "The Music and the Mirror" helped earn her the 1976 Tony Award for Best Actress in a Musical.

McKechnie originated the role through the workshops, Off-Broadway and Broadway iterations, and stayed with the musical through its first national tour. While she has gone on to give many other acclaimed performances, she will forever be associated with Cassie.
